The Complementary and Natural Healthcare Council (CNHC) was set up by the government to protect the public by providing a UK voluntary register of complementary therapists.

CNHC is the holder of an Accredited Register. This means CNHC has met the demanding standards of the government-appointed accrediting body, the Professional Standards Authority.

### What does the CNHC do?

- > Keeps a register of practitioners who meet national standards of practice in their work
- > Sets the standards that practitioners need to meet to get onto and then stay on the register
- > Requires registered practitioners to keep to its Code of Conduct, Ethics and Performance
- > Investigates complaints about alleged breaches of the code
- > Imposes sanctions or removes practitioners from the register when necessary

To be admitted to the CNHC register, a complementary therapist must:

- > meet 'National Occupational Standards' for their therapy
- > confirm that they do not have a criminal record (including cautions)
- > confirm that there are no health issues that affect their ability to practise
- > confirm that there have not been any disciplinary or civil proceedings taken against them that relate to their practice
- > hold current professional indemnity insurance
- > agree to keep to CNHC's Code of Conduct, Ethics and Performance
- > keep their knowledge and skills up to date
