Who is the course for?

Under the Private Security Industry Authority Act 2001, all individuals wishing to work in the private security industry must undertake a recognised qualification before applying for a licence.

The Level 2 Award in Door Supervision has been developed to meet the requirements of the Security Industry Authority (SIA). It is based on the relevant SIA Specifications for Learning and Qualifications and provides the necessary skills and knowledge for learners who wish to apply for an SIA licence and work as a Door Supervisor within the private security industry.

This course is not **ONLY** for anyone thinking of becoming a Door Supervisor in a Pub or Club, it is also for anyone wishing to work as **Festival Security**.

Complete the course with PROSEC and you could be earning extra money working at **Glastonbury, Reading, Leeds** and lots of other Festivals.

What does the course involve?

This qualification is split into 4 modules and delegates must complete and pass units 1, 2, 3 and 4 as outlined below which will achieve a Level 2 Award in Door Supervision and allow delegates to apply for their SIA licence.

The course is assessed through 4 multiple-choice examinations and a practical assessment.

The course is made up of the following units:

Unit 1: Working in the Private Security Industry

- The purpose and main features of the private security industry.
- The legislation that is relevant to people working in the private security industry
- Relevant aspects of health and safety in the workplace
- The principles of fire Safety
- How to deal with non-fire-related workplace emergencies
- The principles of effective communication and customer care in the private security industry

Unit 2: Working as a Door Supervisor

- Behaviour appropriate for individual door supervisors, as defined by the Security Industry Authority's (SIA) Standards of Behaviour
- Civil and criminal law relevant to door supervisors
- Search procedures and the reasons for having them
- Powers of arrest and related procedures
- Drug legislation and its relevance to the role of the door



- supervisor
- Incident recording and crime scene preservation
- Licensing law and social responsibility
- Procedures for emergency situations

Unit 3: Conflict Management for the Private Security Industry

- The principles of conflict management appropriate to their role
- How to recognise, assess and reduce risk in conflict situations
- Communicate effectively in emotive situations and deescalate conflict and exit routes
- How to develop and use problem solving strategies for resolving conflict
- Good practice to follow after Conflict Situations.



Unit 4: Physical Intervention Skills for the Private Security Industry

- Physical interventions and the legal and professional implications of their use
- Reducing the risk of harm when physical intervention skills are used
- Using non-pain related physical skills to protect yourself and others from assault
- Using non-pain related standing holding and escorting techniques, including non-restrictive and restrictive skills
- Good practice to follow after physical interventions

Are there any entry requirements?

The course is designed to teach individuals to work within the Security Industry and will involve being taught how to undertake Physical restraint / intervention in a safe and competent manner. Although no formal qualifications are required, individuals need to have the capacity to read and write and the physical ability to undertake and perform the physical skills required.

The course does require you to be in reasonable physical condition. You do not have to be a paragon of fitness, but you will be required to have the physical capability to undertake the activity. Therefore, if you do have any physical impairment which you feel may compromise your ability to undertake the course please seek the advice of a medical professional before attending.

The qualification can be undertaken by learners aged 16 or over who wish to work as a Door Supervisor. However, an SIA licence cannot be applied for until the age of 18.

How long is the course?

This course is delivered over 4 complete days and does require some pre-course reading and evening study.



Where is the course delivered?

The course is delivered at our purpose built training facility in Westbury, however if you would like a group booking to take place in a suitable training environment that is more convenient to you, our trainers can provide mobile training at a suitable venue of your choice.

How much will this course cost?

Current course costs per candidate are £150.00 (+VAT), this includes examination and certification fees.
